

The theme of the event is history of the Territorial period. Tombstone would not be here today if not for the U.S. Army sending in soldiers to establish Camp Huachuca. The cemetery is filled with veterans of many wars including the Civil War. Those who chose to make Tombstone their home were veterans of that Great War. The Indian wars were still being fought in this area until the 1886 surrender of the great warrior Geronimo.

While the period of historic significance for Tombstone is 1879 to 1929. We desire to embrace all facets of our history to tell the full tale of Tombstone and the Territorial period from 1863-1912.

Friday, September 16th: A school day is planned for this day. Educational demonstrations and talks are encouraged to be presented if participating on this day.

Saturday, September 17th: There will be an encampment and a chuck wagon competition at the old Tombstone High School football field on Allen Street. The chuck wagon competition will be judged on the authenticity of the wagon outfit, dress of the cooks, and the best food cooked in cast iron pots. There will be chuck wagons competing and food available for 250 people. On Saturday only, the Mormon Battalion Band will be performing in the City Park at 2:00. And a grand ball will be held in the evening, tickets and appropriate clothing are required.

Sunday, September 18th: A non-motorized parade will be held at 11:00 a.m. The Ballet Folklorico dancers will be performing on Allen Street after the parade.

There is no registration fee for this event.

Participants in the encampment site **must be preregistered** no later than August 30, 2016.

- Proof of Insurance must be presented showing "City of Tombstone" as additional insured.
- Participants must be from the 1863-1912 eras.
- In Ground fires are permitted. Turf must be replaced after event.
- Fire extinguishers must be available at each site with a cooking fire.
- All preregistered participants will be eligible for a waived entry fee in the Sunday parade.
- Those participating as presenters in the Friday School Day will be provided a meal at the school site. (Preregistration required.)
- All preregistered participants will be eligible for drawings for the following;
 - o 10 tickets to the Ball on Saturday night
 - o 10 meal tickets for the Chuck Wagon cook off
 - o 10 event t-shirts
 - Various other prizes and giveaways.
